
Teacher Only Day 30th May 2025 (School Closed)


An explicit reminder to our community that school will be closed for instruction on the 30th May for teacher only day. We will be exploring more information surrounding the curriculum refresh and the adjustments made to our teaching to cater for the implementation of that policy.

School Wide Achievement 2024

We as a school have really good data that is captured in end of year and mid year school reporting, plus an academic value added per year, along with longitudinal data that captures each child's achievement position annually, and finally a class action plan report. There are several others too, but the main four are highlighted here.

As a school we have to report to the MInistry with data in core subjects in male and female gender groups and ethnic groupings. I have provided overall group data here and realise data sharing has sensitivity considerations especially if we break it down too much.





171 children were included in the data. We have 11% WB and 18% B the preferred curriculum level. 71% were working AT or AB the expecte curriculum level. This is above where we were sitting for maths in the previous year.

As you can see we have many children achieving where we would expect and some above where we would expect. Our data has generally been similar for quite a number of years. Unfortunately we have a good number below or well below where we would like, which is often connected to 8 barriers to learning, including absence. Absence really impacts negatively on learning in most cases. For any more information around achievement, you are most welcome to view any report that keeps individual children confidential while giving you a picture of how the children of the school are performing. Curriculum Refresh and your child's achievement

It is worth noting that the curriculum refresh prescribes achievement objectives to teach in any given year group. When embedding the refreshed curriculum it is expected that school reporting is directly linked to the year group achievement objectives. As a result of this it is possible some children will have gaps as the teaching sequence of the curriculum refresh as it differs from the teaching sequence of our Numicon Maths Programme and literacy teaching. As a result we may have a data dip and a sense that your child is not achieving where they should be. I can assure you, it will mainly be a case of a misalignment of what has been taught and what is being reported on initially. Once embedding has occurred after a few years, we are confident of a direct alignment of the teaching and reporting requirement. Like all new systems, they take time to embed.

Hall Hire and School Roll

As we move forward it is highly probable the hall is going to house our library as our library is repurposed into a new entrant classroom due to roll growth. As a school we are quite selective about hall hire as it usually comes with additional issues. If we do place the library in the hall, the hall will not be available for any hire of any kind, as it will house a library. We are sorry about that. The good news is the roll is healthy. I have been advocating to the Ministry of Education for additional teaching space to meet our schools Network roll expectations. The next review is July of this year after the budget announcement. Hopefully, we get something, while being mindful, there are a number of schools nationwide in a similar position with only so much money being allocated to that cause. We will keep you posted when we learn more.

Teacher Aide Position

Ashburton Netherby School is seeking a teacher for Terms 3 and 4 of 2025, part time, general teacher aiding. We imagine this will be for approximately 14 hours per week. This could lead to further work in 2026 if there is a demand for another teacher aide to join our team. The advert going in the paper is here. Government Parent Portal

As you may know or not, there is now a Parent Portal which is an online platform that provides parents and whānau with easy- to-use resources and tools to support their child's education at home. It allows them to work in partnership with their school or kura and to keep informed about what their child is learning, by including:

- Year-by-year Curriculum Learning Guides: parent-friendly versions of both The New Zealand Curriculum and Te Marautanga o Aotearoa, detailing what children are learning, why it's important, and when they'll be learning it.
- Practice activities: activities that parents and whānau can use to support their child's learning at home, such as phonics cards with audio files to model correct sounds.
- Informative videos and resources: videos explaining new assessments like the Phonics Checks and Hihira Weteoro, which help identify additional support a child might need, and resources to help parents prepare for the first day of school and

parent-teacher interviews.

We really would like it if you get familiar with the portal and use it to work in partnership with us.



Attendance - Front and Centre

With attendance every day does matter. If your child is marginal and you are doubtful about whether to send them to school or not, send them to school and we will send them home again if they do become too unwell. WE NEED YOUR HELP TO IMPROVE our school attendance. We appreciate your support and know it can be tricky at times to get your child to school.

SEND ME TO SCHOOL/KURA

- I have a runny nose or just a slight cough
- I haven't had a fever for the last 24 hours and haven't needed any medicine
- I haven't vomited or had any diarrhoea for 24 hours and haven't needed any medicine
- If you have had norovirus or another notifiable vomiting and diarrhoea illness, come to school only after 48 hours since you have last vomited or had diarrhoea
- I have tummy pain or a headache with no diarrhoea, vomiting or fever, but I'm comfortable enough to take part in school activities.

KEEP ME AT HOME

- My temperature is 38°C or higher or I need medicine to keep my temperature down
- I have vomited or had diarrhoea in the last 24 hours
- I have vomited and or had diarrhoea due to norovirus or another notifiable illness within the last 48 hours
- I have an unexplained rash
- My eyes are pink and crusty
