Teacher Only Day 30th May 2025

A thank you note for keeping your children home so we could have our Teacher Only Day. We covered a lot. We looked at the descriptors, various areas of the curriculum refresh, the parent portal, our school reports, thoughts for our future strategic planning, FASDs notes, BSLA and other literacy practice and other information. It was quite an informative day.

Curriculum Refresh and your child's achievement

There will be a letter that accompanies the school reports at mid year to explain the new descriptors we will be using and the gap of attainment that may occur as we shift from one curriculum to another. It is worth a read and may answer some questions you have.

Hall Hire and School Roll

As we move forward it is highly probable the hall is going to house our library as our library is repurposed into a new entrant classroom due to roll growth. As a school we are quite selective about hall hire as it usually comes with additional issues. If we do place the library in the hall, the hall will not be available for any hire of any kind, as it will house a library. We are sorry about that. The good news is the roll is healthy. I have been advocating to the Ministry of Education for additional teaching space to meet our school's roll projection. The next review was in May of this year after the budget announcement. Unfortunately we missed out again with most classrooms being built in Christchurch or Selwyn. This confirms the hall will also be a library going forward.



Teacher Aide Position

This role has been really well subscribed too. We have a number of experienced applicants too. It will be a hard decision, but it is good to have a choice. If you applied and did not get an interview please do not let that deter you in the future. Applicant numbers and experience of applicants seems to be cyclical. Currently, there are a good number of applicants with the right experience and skills to apply. This is not always the case.

Scale A Teaching Positions

As we come into term 3 unusual staffing needs have arisen due to someone expressing they are moving on, and another teacher who is needing leave to recover from an operation. As a result of this we are needing:

A registered teacher preferably from the start of Term 3, until the end of Term 4 full time, in the senior area of the school.

And a registered teacher to work 3 days per week in the middle area of the school and to backfill any sick days or release that will be needed.

If you know of a teacher who may have been away due to maternity leave, or has had a break, and are contemplating teaching again for a spell, please let them know of these positions. The children of all classes needing a part time or full time teacher are well behaved and motivated learners.

Government Parent Portal

As you may know or not, there is now a Parent Portal which is an online platform that provides parents and whānau with easy- to-use resources and tools to support their child's education at home. It allows them to work in partnership with their school or kura and to keep informed about what their child is learning, by including:

- Year-by-year Curriculum Learning Guides: parent-friendly versions of both The New Zealand Curriculum and Te Marautanga o Aotearoa, detailing what children are learning, why it's important, and when they'll be learning it.
- Practice activities: activities that parents and whānau can use to support their child's learning at home, such as phonics cards with audio files to model correct sounds.

• Informative videos and resources: videos explaining new assessments like the Phonics Checks and Hihira Weteoro, which help identify additional support a child might need, and resources to help parents prepare for the first day of school and parent-teacher interviews.

We really would like it if you get familiar with the portal and use it to work in partnership with us.

Attendance - Front and Centre

With attendance every day does matter. If your child is marginal and you are doubtful about whether to send them to school or not, send them to school and we will send them home again if they do become too unwell. WE NEED YOUR HELP TO IMPROVE our school attendance. We appreciate your support and know it can be tricky at times to get your child to school.

As you will see from the news and so forth, the Ministry is really big on getting 80% of children attending 90% of the time. We are sitting at only 65% and 62% attendance at 90% of the time, so a wee way to go. We do understand it is a fine juggling act between staying home if unwell and coming to school to keep attendance high.

SEND ME TO SCHOOL/KURA

- I have a runny nose or just a slight cough
- I haven't had a fever for the last 24 hours and haven't needed any medicine
- I haven't vomited or had any diarrhoea for 24 hours and haven't needed any medicine
- If you have had norovirus or another notifiable vomiting and diarrhoea illness, come to school only after 48 hours since you have last vomited or had diarrhoea
- I have tummy pain or a headache with no diarrhoea, vomiting or fever, but I'm comfortable enough to take part in school activities.

KEEP ME AT HOME

- My temperature is 38°C or higher or I need medicine to keep my temperature down
- I have vomited or had diarrhoea in the last 24 hours

- I have vomited and or had diarrhoea due to norovirus or another notifiable illness within the last 48 hours
- I have an unexplained rash
- My eyes are pink and crusty
