We are devastated and feel saddened particularly given Netherby School was a pilot school for Kai for Kids. We have a long standing relationship with Kai for Kids. I am sure I speak for the community, children, staff and Board in saying that we are disappointed that the new lunch model will not employ local people, use local produce all while having a small carbon footprint let alone a personalised relationship with the provider.

On an optimistic note Kai for Klds will continue to deliver a rich and nutritious morning tea, something the new provider in 2026, Mammoth Brands and Subway, do not. Kai for Klds have really championed healthy food choices and habits and despite the devastating news, are still here doing just that for morning tea in 2026. Their actions speak volumes about where their hearts lie.

We have a Kia for Kids special Christmas lunch soon where we will thank the staff personally.

Two New Classrooms Updates

After some discussion most involved believe the best place for the classrooms is beside the PE shed which sits beside the hall. We can move the PE shed, but at big cost, with the advisor suggesting we leave the shed where it is to save funds for the classrooms. Surprisingly, most classrooms do not come with toilets. We have presented a fairly sound case that I believe has convinced the MOE property advisors to advocate for these classrooms to be delivered with toilets. I am hopeful. The time frame is hard to gauge, especially given we now require and need toilets. I am loosely suggesting we could have the classrooms on site by June or July of 2026. Please be mindful the picture below is just a screenshot of two classrooms I found online. How our classrooms look will be decided once we have a confirmed type we can choose from.



Annual Knockout Chess Tournament

I love the annual knockout chess tournament. It is the culmination of many games and tuition with those who practice on Li Chess learning the most and having the edge. 8 children made the call to play in what is a high stakes and high pressure knockout tournament. Mistakes can be costly with children needing to be highly focused and extremely careful to not lose pieces cheaply as well as being aware of opportunities that present themselves through the course of the game. Well done to Brax, Jayke, Abel, Eli, Issac, Emily, Saane and Arthur who contested the 2025 chess trophy.





Third and fourth placements were contested between Abel and Emily and the final between Saane and Arthur. The 3rd placed game was tight initially, before Abel ran away with it in the end game. Well done Emily for fighting so hard and for getting to the semi finals. Nice job Abel for placing 3rd.

The final was epic with Saane having the game in her grasp for much of the contest and even down to the start of the end game. She did not realise it, but for a number of moves was just two moves away from an unstoppable check mate. In saying that the moves were not obvious and required a bishop move that for many would look sacrificial, but was not. Credit to Arthur who was down on points and position right until the end game. He really zoned in and showed good composure, concentration and foresight to eventually get three pawns ahead at the very end game. After an hour and at 3pm, it was clear Athur was winning the game on both points and position. Extremely well done Arthur for winning and hard lines Saane, but great effort all the same to win second place. Saane and Arthur are evenly matched and either of them could have won.

Attendance - Front and Centre

With attendance every day does matter. If your child is marginal and you are doubtful about whether to send them to school or not, send them to school and we will send them home again if they do become too unwell. WE NEED YOUR HELP TO IMPROVE our school attendance. We appreciate your support and know it can be tricky at times to get your child to school. As you will see from the news and so forth, the Ministry is really big on getting 80% of children attending school 90% of the time. We are sitting at only 65% of attendance 90% of the time mid term 4, so a long way to go. On a positive it is good to have 85% of children here 80% of the time at mid way of Term 4.

The start of Term 4 attendance has been amazing. This is how we want to be running as a school community, or even better if we can. Thank you for your efforts in getting your children to school. It is such a worthy pursuit. We are looking at ways to incentivise consistent attendance in 2026 without pushing to a place where children are coming to school sick and spreading illness. A fine line to walk as you know.

Remember, we do have a bus service running that can collect children and deliver them to school. Contact me if you would like to talk about this for your child.

Please apply the below criteria to continue aiming to get your children to school as frequently as possible.

SEND ME TO SCHOOL/KURA

- I have a runny nose or just a slight cough
- I haven't had a fever for the last 24 hours and haven't needed any medicine
- I haven't vomited or had any diarrhoea for 24 hours and haven't needed any medicine
- If you have had norovirus or another notifiable vomiting and diarrhoea illness, come to school only after 48 hours since you have last vomited or had diarrhoea
- I have tummy pain or a headache with no diarrhoea, vomiting or fever, but I'm comfortable enough to take part in school activities.

KEEP ME AT HOME

- My temperature is 38°C or higher or I need medicine to keep my temperature down
- I have vomited or had diarrhoea in the last 24 hours
- I have vomited and or had diarrhoea due to norovirus or another notifiable illness within the last 48 hours
- I have an unexplained rash
- My eyes are pink and crusty

If your child is sick, has an appointment or will be late to school, please ring the school office on 308 5799 or text 027 752 2488 or put the absence through the skool loop app, so we are aware of their whereabouts and know they are safe.
